## Face the facts: STROKE IS TREATABLE. Get involved. World Stroke Day, October 29





## About World Stroke Day – Saturday 29 October 2016

Under the campaign theme 'Face the Facts: Stroke is treatable' the WSO is highlighting six key facts which can dramatically improve stroke outcomes.

- 1 Early recognition makes a big difference so we encourage the public to learn the signs of F.A.S.T.
- 2 Organized stroke care in specialized stroke care units improves the chance of a good outcome by 14%. Stroke units are the centerpiece of the WSO Global Stroke Guidelines (*IJS 2014*). All stroke patients should be able to access essential stroke services, regardless of the economic setting.
- 3 The use of tPA, (intravenous thrombolysis) improves the chance of a good outcome by 30% in appropriate patients.
- 4 The exciting advance of endovascular thrombectomy means that a dramatic 50% of those eligible for treatment with blocked large arteries can potentially have a better outcome with endovascular intervention, carried out in advanced, comprehensive stroke centers.
- 5 Rehabilitation is a critical step in the treatment process.
- 6 Primary and secondary prevention treatments and lifestyle changes can reduce the risk of a stroke.
